

Liege: From 10pm on 30 June to 6am on 26 August, last summer of safety restoration of E25-E40/A602 link in Cointe tunnel towards Brussels by SOFICO - Traffic ban for transit vehicles (over 7.5T and long vehicles)

To be specific, during this summer (2024), from 10pm on June 30 to 6am on August 26, the E25-E40/A602 link, only in the direction of Brussels, will be closed to traffic between exit 38 'Angleur/Grosses Battes/Belle-Ile' and exit 35 'Avroy/Laveu'.

From 10pm on 14 June to 6am on 26 August, the Val

Benoit/Seraing/Marche exit at junction 37 towards Brussels will be closed to traffic.



In addition, from 5 to 9 August and from 11 to 14 August, the E25-E40/A602 link will have to be closed at night from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m., in the other direction, in the direction of Luxembourg, to work in the polluted air galleries of the Cointe tunnel towards Brussels.

ACTIONS TO RELIEVE LIEGE ROADS :

Liège, located in the heart of the Euregio, attracts a lot of **through traffic**. A series of measures are therefore being taken to ensure that Liège residents, day trippers (or those staying a little longer) and customers enjoy smoother transit. The actions cover **transit** traffic of private vehicles, but also vehicles over 7.5 tonnes as well as long vehicles (including caravans and coaches).

Through traffic heading north (the Netherlands, Germany, Brussels) should avoid the Liège conurbation and take the following diversions route:

- Those wishing to travel north from the south (Luxembourg) continue their journey via the E411/A4 towards Namur and then via the E42/A15 towards Liège.
- 2. Lorries heavier than 7.5 tonnes and vehicles longer than 6 metres (including caravans and buses) in transit to the north (the Netherlands, Germany, Brussels) will be PROHIBITED in the Liège conurbation :

- via the E25/A26 from the Neufchâteau interchange (E25-E411/A4).

Specific signage will be installed to indicate the prohibited space in advance and direct users to the alternative route (via the E42/A15 and E411/A4 motorways). **Only local services will be allowed** for this type of vehicles (goods and passenger transport).

- For local services on the outskirts of Liège, users coming from the south (E25/A26) are requested to follow the diversions via the exit at exit 38 'Angleur/Grosses Battes/Belle-lle', the N30/rue des Vennes-boulevard de Douai- boulevard Froidmond- boulevard Frankignoul- boulevard Raymond Poincaré, the N90/quais Orban - Longdoz - Bonaparte - du Roi Albert (Quais de Meuse), then the motorway E25/A25 until the Cheratte interchange (E25/A25-E40/A3). This route is marked 'B'.

3. More than one mobility solution:

Since 1 September 2021, the car parks at Angleur and Esneux stations and the P+R TEC Vottem can be used as **FREE** parking facilities. Users can therefore leave their car there and take the train or bus or opt for a shared bike/step to get into or out of the city quickly and comfortably.

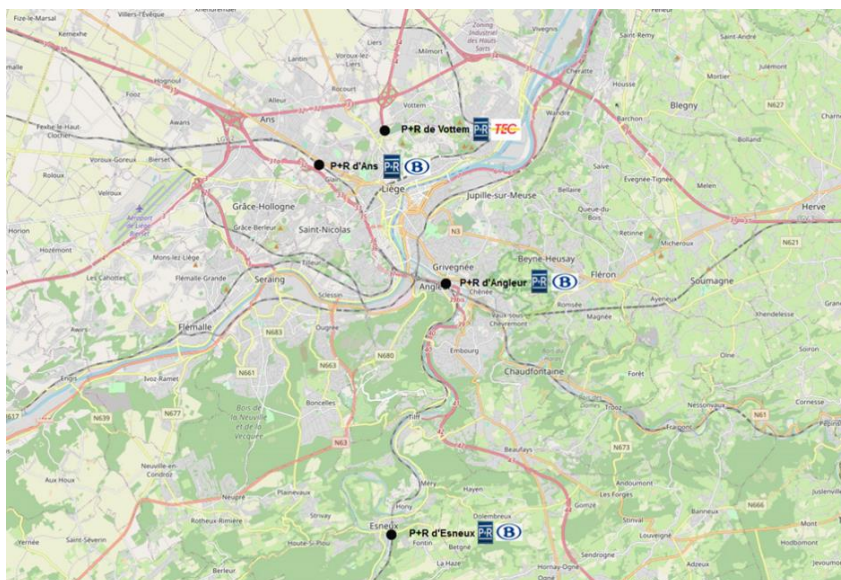
By train : fast, comfortable with parking facilities (P+R) for cars

The car parks at Angleur (4 trains/h), Ans (3 trains/h) and Esneux (2 trains/h) stations can be used as P+R car parks. Users can leave their car there and take the train to go into or out of the city.

Here are some figures on travel times by train from different stations to Liège-Guillemins : from Angleur 4 min, Ans 7 min, Esneux 15 to 20 min or Chaudfontaine 10 min, Visé 18 min, Maastricht 32 min...

Apart from the various car parks, a free P+R is also available near Angleur station.

Travellers are invited to plan their journey via SNCB's app or the website www.nmbs.be



SOFICO has placed signs near the exits of Liège motorways to guide drivers more easily to the SNCB and P+R car parks.

Permanent signposts have also been placed outside the motorways.

The bus : into the heart of neighbourhoods and the availability of a P+R !

The bus is an ideal way to reach the heart of any neighbourhood. Check letec.be or the TEC app for timetables and routes.

To complement the car, consider a P+R. From the Vottem P+R, located at the end of the A313 motorway, lines 39 and 71 will take you to the city centre in 15 minutes.

The bicycle : efficient, fast and healthy

Liège not only boasts the largest pedestrian zone in Wallonia but also more than 100 km of cycling infrastructure, more than 4,000 parking spaces for bikes.

Sharesteps and electric bikes at Angleur and Vottem P+R car parks

Micro-mobility is becoming increasingly important in all big cities, and Liege is no exception! In agreement with the operators in Liege, share steps and electric bikes will also be available in the two free P+R car parks: Angleur and Vottem.

By car : anticipate to park

Drivers can use the 'Liège en poche' app to find the nearest pay parking near their destination or to find the most convenient parking based on their position!

Dynamic signs on the city's territory also guide you to free parking spaces. They indicate the number of available spaces. This makes it easier to find a parking space, reducing traffic pressure, making traffic flow more smoothly and reducing environmental impact.
